Bruce D. Rubin currently serves as the Principal of Rubin Consulting LLC. He advises firms in the energy and chemical sector. He has focused his efforts in the private equity space and with venture capital opportunities. Mr. Rubin is a Director of Braskem America, Inc., where he served as CEO during the transition from Sunoco to Braskem and supported the company in external affairs and institutional relations as a senior executive. In addition, Mr. Rubin is an Executive Advisor for Court Square Capital Partners, a private equity firm focused on leverage buyouts. He is also a Director of Sylvatex, a fuels technology company.

Mr. Rubin served as Senior Vice President of Sunoco Inc., and CEO of Sunoco Chemicals, from 2008 to 2010, where he had profit and loss responsibility for Sunoco's chemicals business, (4B\$ in revenues) including polymers, phenol and related products, and petrochemicals. This responsibility included setting direction to improve short-term profitability, as well as positioning the business for future growth. Prior to assuming this role, Mr. Rubin served concurrently as Vice President of Sunoco's polypropylene business and as President of Epsilon Products Company, a joint venture between Sunoco and BAR-L from 2002 to 2007.

Mr. Rubin joined Sunoco in 1979 and held increasingly responsible positions in a range of areas across the corporation. As Director of Corporate Business Development, Mr. Rubin was active in Sunoco's acquisition of Aristech Chemical Corporation in 2001. From 1995 to 2000, he played a key role in returning the regional Midwest refining business to profitability. In addition, he has held positions in engineering, strategic planning, operational planning, finance, systems and trading.

Mr. Rubin earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Pennsylvania's Towne School of Engineering, as well as a Master of Business Administration in Finance and Management from Widener University. He has also completed coursework at University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School and Graduate School of Engineering.

An active participant in industry matters, Mr. Rubin served on the American Chemistry Council's board of directors and chaired the organization's plastics committee. He also serves on the AFPM/NPRA petrochemical board and the CEO Council of Growth for the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Rubin has also served on the board of directors of The Franklin Institute.
