

Wrap-up for Chemical Process Safety Conference

75 chemical engineer professionals, students and faculty attended the Dec 2nd Process Safety Conference at Widener University. 11 speakers provided a 360 degree perspective on the tragedy at Bhopal for this daylong event that was jointly produced by Widener University Dept of Chemical Engineering and the Philadelphia / Del Val Section of AIChE.

Peter Joyce, President of Value Recovery Inc held a HAZOP workshop for students using his start-up company as an very interesting example. Mike Hazzan, Manager- Eastern Business Chemetica Inc/ Unit for Acutech kicked off the conference with a history of what happened at Bhopal. PQ's Corporate Manager of Engineering, Lou Henderson followed with an overview of Process Safety Man-Ms Sharmila agement. Widener Grad Stu-Rao. dent. offered her personal account of growing up in India during the aftermath of Bhopal and becoming a chemical engineer. Professor of Philosophy Dr David Ward, lead the audience through a series of questions to examine the ethics of USA companies ex-

porting technology. **Joseph Sieben** from ASPEN / Hysis demonstrated how a dynamic simulator can be surprisingly useful in "what-if" analysis. **Al Baginski** from the EPA explained how EPA's RMP program handles safety "outside the fence" whereas OSHA's PSM handles employee safety. Rohm & Haas's Manager of Hazard Assessment and Environmental Engineering, **Gregory Keeports** delivered the talk, *Inherently Safer Design*. PA State Representative **Thomas Gannon** discussed the oil spill from the tanker ship in the Delaware River. **Dorothy Kellogg**, Senior Director for Security for the American Chemistry Council, outlined the *Responsible Care* Program and the post- 911 program expansion addressing homeland security.

After dinner, AIChE CEO Lecturer and Keynote Speaker, **James Porter** explained Dupont's safety culture where leading indicators are tracked until they are eliminated and then the next leading indicator becomes the object of attention. James is Vice President of Environment, Health and Safety, engineering and Chief Engineer for Dupont and a member of the advisory board for AIChE's Center of Chemical Process Safety (CCPS)

Widener University rolled out the red carpet for our Philadelphia Chemical Engineering community. After a complimentary lunch , **Dr Jo Allen**, Sr Vice President and University Provost welcomed the attendees. he Election is over. Regardless who your choice was for President, the job outlook is better when there is certainty. There is pent up demand as projects have been languishing and will now need to be completed soon. The job seekers are getting many more inquiries and requests for interviews. Companies realize that if they do nothing, the competition will move in to take away opportunities. Hopefully, we will see a shorter list of job seekers in 2005.

The local companies that have been reducing staff all year are again posting new positions. Monster and the other big job boards are still mostly listing search-firms that are acquiring resumes for their file cabinets. The difference is the search-firms are beginning to match those resumes with clients again.

Last time energy prices were high, there was a big demand for Chemical Engineers to squeeze every BTU out of a process. I don't see that demand this time. It may be because so many energy intensive processes have moved overseas. Those companies that remain use fewer employees to get the same number of pounds out the door.

The projects I am working on are for high value products where the energy contribution is minimal. The value of these products comes from the information content (patents, quality and knowledge input). People that can configure and maintain automated systems are in the biggest demand. People who have jobs that can be automated are at the greatest risk.

As you are observing your own job situation and thinking about the best way to advance your career, your point of view is valuable. Feedback from the membership biases the outlook of the professional development column. I hear mostly from people once they are out of work. This gives a clear picture of what is not working for our membership. Those that are working are often too busy to come to AIChE meetings. Your emails and phone calls are needed to keep this column on track.


