"Moving Beyond the Black Box: The Development of In-Line Measurements to Improve Pharmaceutical Process Understanding" Thursday February 24, 2004

oin us on Thursday February 24, 2004 to hear Dr. James Zega of Merck & Co. present a talk entitled "Moving Beyond the Black Box: The Development of In-Line Measurements to Improve Pharmaceutical Process Understanding." cally, pharmaceutical process development relied on a black box approach. These black box approaches often use statistically designed experiments with machine operating parameters as variables. The operating variables, typically, are not directly related to the fundamental physical phenomena governing the processes. An alternative approach is to develop instrumentation and monitoring techniques or process analytical technologies (PAT) to provide more direct and physically meaningful measure-Merck's lab has developed a "toolbox" of these techniques for key pharmaceutical unit operations; including high shear wet granulation, roller compaction and column coating. use of these techniques facilitates a deeper understanding of the fundamentals of pharmaceutical processes and provides a mean to reduce process development resources through more focused experimental designs

Biography: Jim Zega is Director of the Solids Pharmaceutical Development Group at Merck Research Laboratories (MRL) in West Point, PA. He manages the group that prepares clinical supply materials and develops pharmaceutical processes for tablets and capsules. In addition, his group scales up these processes and transfers the technologies to the commercial manufacturing sites. Prior to joining MRL, Jim was in

Dinner was served in the Library Room and was followed by Mr. Signore's talk.


#### It covered:


