Enjoy a complementary beer tasting (for those aged 21+), appetizers, wood-fired brick oven pizza, wings, salad, socializing, and insanely good beer.

Victory Brewing is a privatelyheld craft brewery, located in Downingtown, Chester County, Pennsylvania. It developed from a partnership of two childhood friends begun on the back of a school bus in 1973.

Victory opened in 1996 in an old Pepperidge Farm factory, where it has grown to become one of the best craft breweries in America. Victory began to gain national recognition with their very first beer, Victory Hop Devil, a hoppy India pale ale. Ever since, Victory has been producing incredibly bold beers "for those who appreciate flavorful beer."

# The Value of a Specialty Fabricator – Turning Ideas into Valuable Assets By Eric Sipe, CDI

ou need a special container to allow your operators to charge solids to a reactor in a closed fashion to eliminate the potential of a fire or explosion. Where do you turn to find someone who can help you design and fabricate a suitable container? You need a dip tube that projects into a reactor near the baffle but misses the blades of the agitator. Who can design and fabricate a dip tube that will meet your demanding requirements? You get a quote from a filter supplier for a special duty filter that is far beyond your allotted time for procuring this item? What can you do?

In all of these cases I called upon a specialty fabricator to turn my needs and ideas into valuable assets. The value of a specialty fabricator lies in their ability to turn metal and ideas into assemblies or apparatus that can meet your needs. Often, they can and will do it much faster than the supposed industry leaders. Additionally, if you have an ongoing relationship with your fabricator he will give you a level of service unattainable when dealing with the major suppliers of fabricated equipment.

Specialty fabricators work with metal of various alloys, vessels, piping and fittings all of the time therefore they can be an invaluable resources for assisting you with the design of a solution for your special assembly. They may also be able to design and fabricate a filter, heat exchanger, or other piece of equipment and build it much faster and at less cost then an "approved" supplier of these items.

Some specialty fabricators assemble skidded systems with associated piping and control system. These fabricators can make your life easier by being a one stop source for a special system you need in your process or plant. The value of buying a pre-fabricated skid lies in the ability to have the system assembled, tested and proven at the fabricators site. Therefore when the equipment comes to your site you can plug it into its place in the plant, hook-up the utilities, run a battery of tests, and your on your way.

Specialty fabricators have a variety of tools and resources in their repertoires that enable them to cut, bend, weld, polish, and passivate metals to make assets that will fulfill your special case processing needs. Specialty fabricators also have in house or outsourced capabilities for performing machining of special parts and assemblies. They can also make recommendations on methods

at Victory now brew more than 20 varieties, according to season and demand. Their Golden Monkey Tripel won a silver medal in the 2004 International Beer Competition in London. Their popular Hop Devil Ale earned the title of "Champion American Beer" in the Great British Beer Festival in 2002. Both Men's Journal and the New York Times rated their Prima Pilsner the best pilsner style in the world.

These highly desirable, award-winning Victory beers are now marketed in 22 states. The brewery has increased its capacity from 1,750 to over 70,000 barrels a year through a series of expansions, including a Rolec 50 barrel brew house, additional fermentation tanks, and a state-of-theart German bottling line.
